



Situate in Rush township, Schuylkill County By Virtue of a warrant to me James Price Directed, by the Surveyor General dated January 31st AD. 1848 granted to Samuel May for improved land, which land appears to have been surveyed by Richard Heath for Samuel May in the year AD. 1812 as the blocking of said lines & corners, count 36 growth, and in persuance of said warrant I have resurveyed and traced up said survey, and market out the closing line to said survey to Samuel May on March 1st AD. 1848.

The improvements consisting of an old clearing being about fifteen or twenty acres with two Log cabbens appearing to be the first buildings and a one story hewn log house with a shindle roof, and a garding before the house, outside of the garden fens a stump and remains of a cherry tree said to have been cut down last summer counted 34 growths, as for other fruit trees, I observed non. Old Jacob Stauffer informed me that to the best of his recolection Samuel May and Henry Kettery had resided on said land about one or two years before the survey was made for Samuel May by Richard Heath the surveyor.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twenty-fifth day of April 1906
