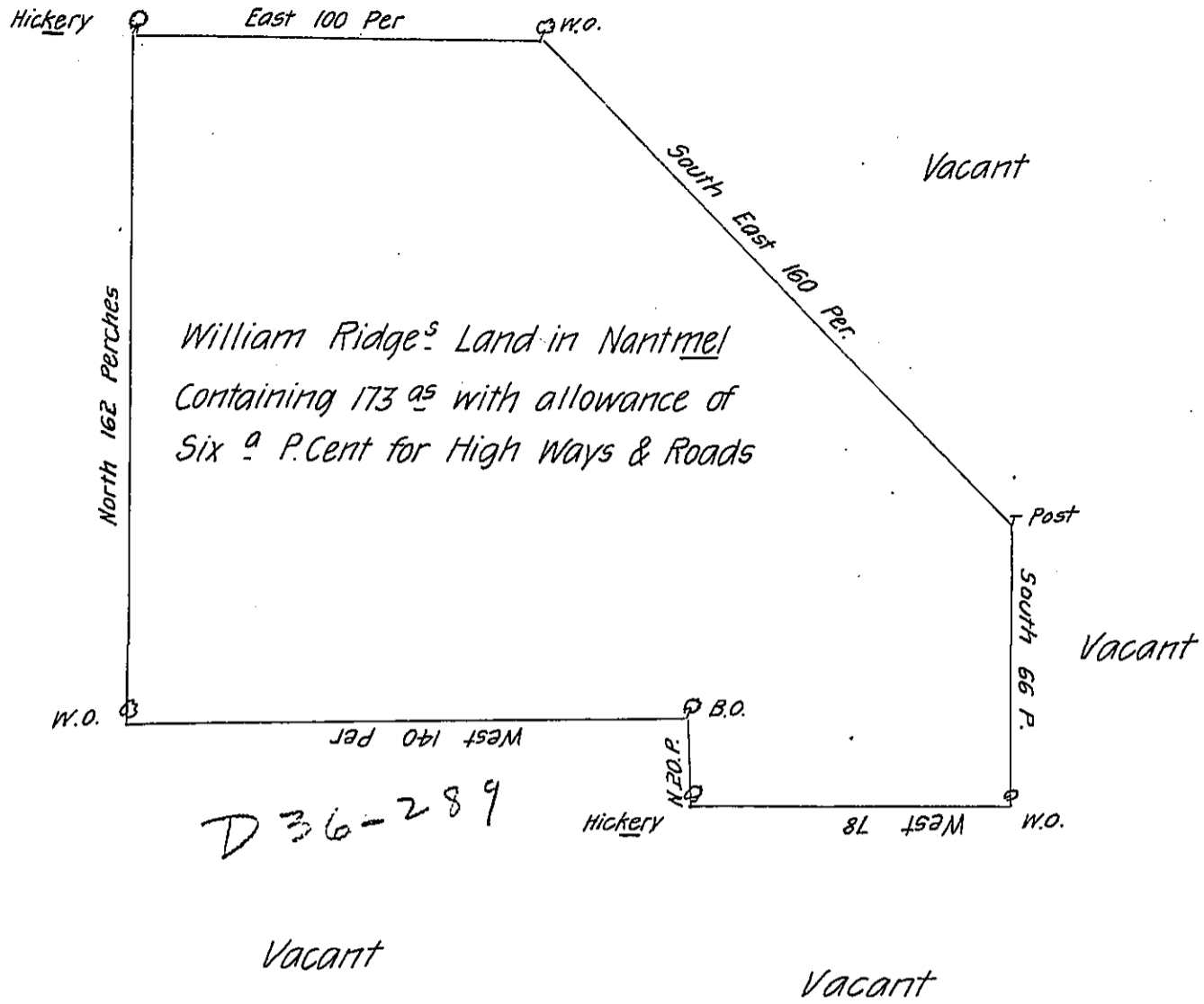

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand of Thomas Penn One of the Proprietaries of the Province of Pennsylvania and the lesser Seal of the said Province bearing date the 18th day of January 1737 I have Surveyed and Laid out unto William Ridge a Tract of Land in Nantmel in Chester County Beginning at a White Oak in the Line of John Frail's Land thence North by the same and Vacant Land 162 Perches to a corner Hickery tree thence East by Vacant Land One hundred Perches to a Corner White Oak thence South East by Vacant Land 160 perches to a Post thence South by Vacant Land 66 Perches to White Oak thence West 78 Perches to a Hickery thence North Twenty Perches to a black Oak thence West 140 Perches to the Beginning Containing One Hundred & Seventy <sup>three</sup> Acres with Allowance of Six Acres P. Cent for high-ways & Roads Surveyed the 28<sup>th</sup> of 8<sup>br</sup> 1740
