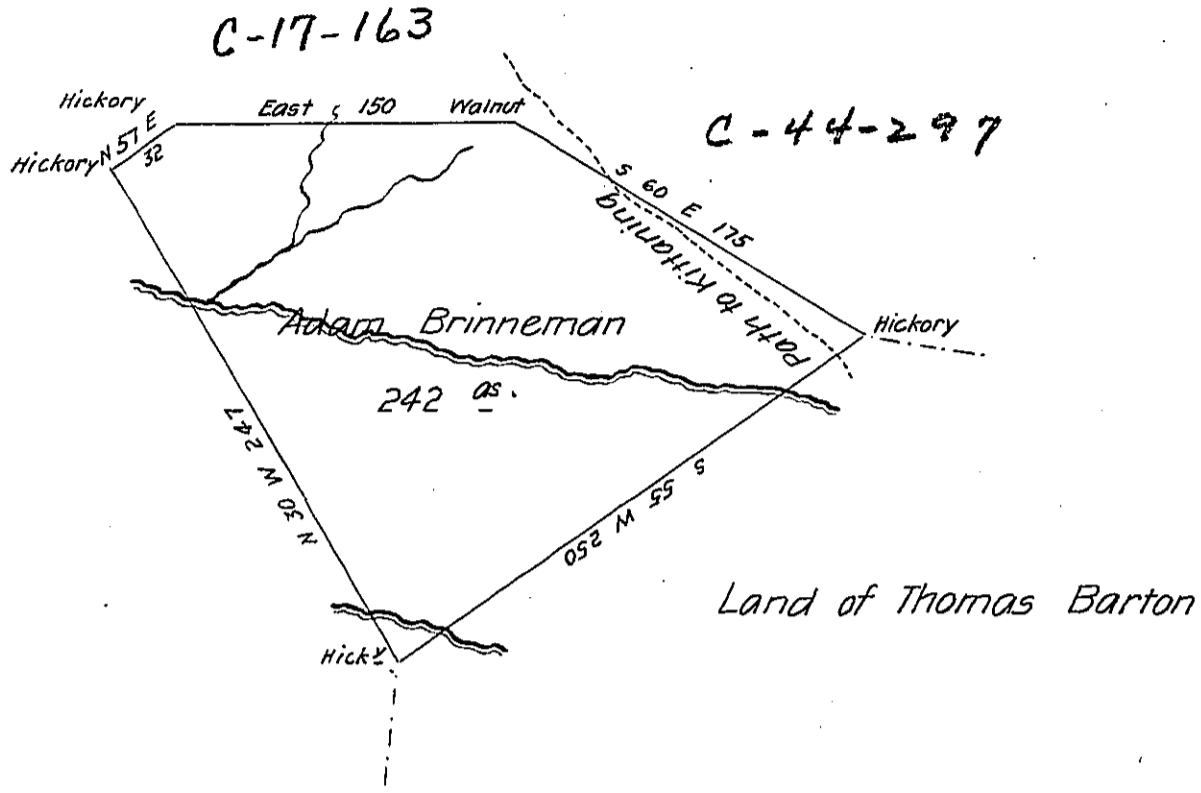


Vacant Hill



A Draught of a tract of Land called the Diamond situate  
 on the Head Waters of the West Branch of Susquehanna - at a  
 place known by the name of Owings or Hart's sleeping place in the County of  
 Bedford containing two hundred and forty two acres and the usual allow-  
 ance of six P. Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 9th day of October 1770 for
