



In pursuance of a Warrant granted to Stephen Jenkins bearing date 22<sup>d</sup> day of April 1746 for taking up the City Lot appurtenant to John Poyer's Orig<sup>l</sup> Purchase of 750 Acres, there was Survey'd to y<sup>e</sup> representatives of said Jenkins a Certain Lot of ground in the City of Philad<sup>a</sup>, between y<sup>e</sup> Second & third Streets from Schuylkill & between Sassafras & Vine Streets. Containing in breadth on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street Ninety feet & in depth two hundred forty seven & an half. Bounded Westw<sup>d</sup> by second Street at<sup>d</sup>, Southw<sup>d</sup> by a Lot laid out to W<sup>m</sup> Allen in right of W<sup>m</sup> Clark - to the Eastw<sup>d</sup> by Lots heretofore sold & to the Northw<sup>d</sup> by vacant ground. Surv<sup>d</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> June 1787.
