



At the request of Wm Peters, Esq<sup>e</sup>, Late Sect<sup>y</sup> of the Land Office, I did Survey on 9<sup>th</sup> day of January 1772, to the s<sup>d</sup>-Peters, Eleven Acres of Liberty land, on the West side of Schuylkill-appurtenant to the Original Purchase of Robt Sandiland of 500 A<sup>c</sup>s, which s<sup>d</sup>-Peters Purchased of Lawrence Growdon, Esq<sup>e</sup>, of the County of Bucks by Deed Dated the 11 Day of Jan, in which Deed it is recited a Warrant was granted bearing date the 10 Day of April for taking up s<sup>d</sup> Liberty land; which if ever Issued is not now to be found, whereupon Rich<sup>d</sup> Peters Esq<sup>e</sup>, son of s<sup>d</sup> Wm Peters Esq<sup>e</sup>, procured a Warr<sup>t</sup> from-Council bearing date 10<sup>th</sup> April 1788, for Surveying & returning s<sup>d</sup> Land these may Certify the same is bounded & Limited ~~as follows~~ as above Described & situate in Blockley.
