



A Draught of a tract of Land Surveyed the 24th day of March 1802. for the Heirs of James M^cFarlane Dec^d by Virtue of a Virginia Certificate Granted to William Parkeson as follows (to wit) We the Commissioners for adjusting claims to unpatented lands in the Counties of Montgomery, Yohogania and Ohio do hereby Certify that William Parkeson Assignee of John Decker is entitled to four hundred Acres of Land in Yohogania County on Pegion Creek to include his settlement made in the year 1770

Given under our hands at Cox's Fort the 26th day of January 1780 in the fourth year of the Commonwealth
