



Situate in German township Fayette County and Surveyed the <sup>11<sup>th</sup> day of June</sup> ~~23<sup>rd</sup> day of June~~ 1835 in pursuance of a Warrant to John Provance for 40 acres of land dated the 23 day of May 1835. this land is now all in a State of Cullivation. there is two small log houses in one of which John Provance resides the first was built 6 or 7 years ago. I believe the part west-erly of the dotted line A to be within the bounds of land of Joseph Provance (father of John) Surveyed on Wt to Joseph Yard Provance in 1771- herein, this is disputed & as it is likely the line between the two old Provance tracts was never run or marked until lately and as the whole boundary contains more land then has been returned, John thinks he can hold the Surplus in his father claim I suppose there will be lawsuit between them to settle their claims &c.
