



In Pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania<sup>a</sup> Passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of Feb.<sup>y</sup> 1785, entitled "an Act for directing the Mode<sup>u</sup> of distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troops of this Common-Wealth," and by order of the Surveyor General, with the Approbation of the Hon.<sup>z</sup> the Executive Council, I have Survey'd on the 8<sup>th</sup> Day of September 1785, the above described Tract of two hundred Acres of Land and Allowance of Six P.C<sup>t</sup> for Roads &c. N° DCCCXVI, situate in District N° 4 on the West side of the Allegany River in the County of Westmoreland.
