



Surveyed on the Twenty Sixth day of October 1733 to Henry Stover a Tract of land Situate on a branch of Perkiome - Commonly Called the West Branch, in the County of Philada - Beginning at a Black Oak Sapling being a Corner of a Tract of land belonging late to William Passmore Deced. thence by the sd land North West one hundred and Ninety Two perches to a post thence by land of Jacob Stover North East one hundred and thirty seven perches to a post thence by Vacant land South East one hundred and Eighty one perches to a post in the line of the Mannour of John Penn Esqr. thence by the same South forty Degrees West one hundred and thirty seven perches to ye place of Beginning Containing one hundred & fifty acres with usual allowance -

Surveyed on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of May 1734  
 By Warrant from the Proprietaries dated ye 28<sup>th</sup> Nich<sup>o</sup>. Scull  
 of May 1734 for 225<sup>ac</sup> of w<sup>ch</sup> sd. Quantity this is part
