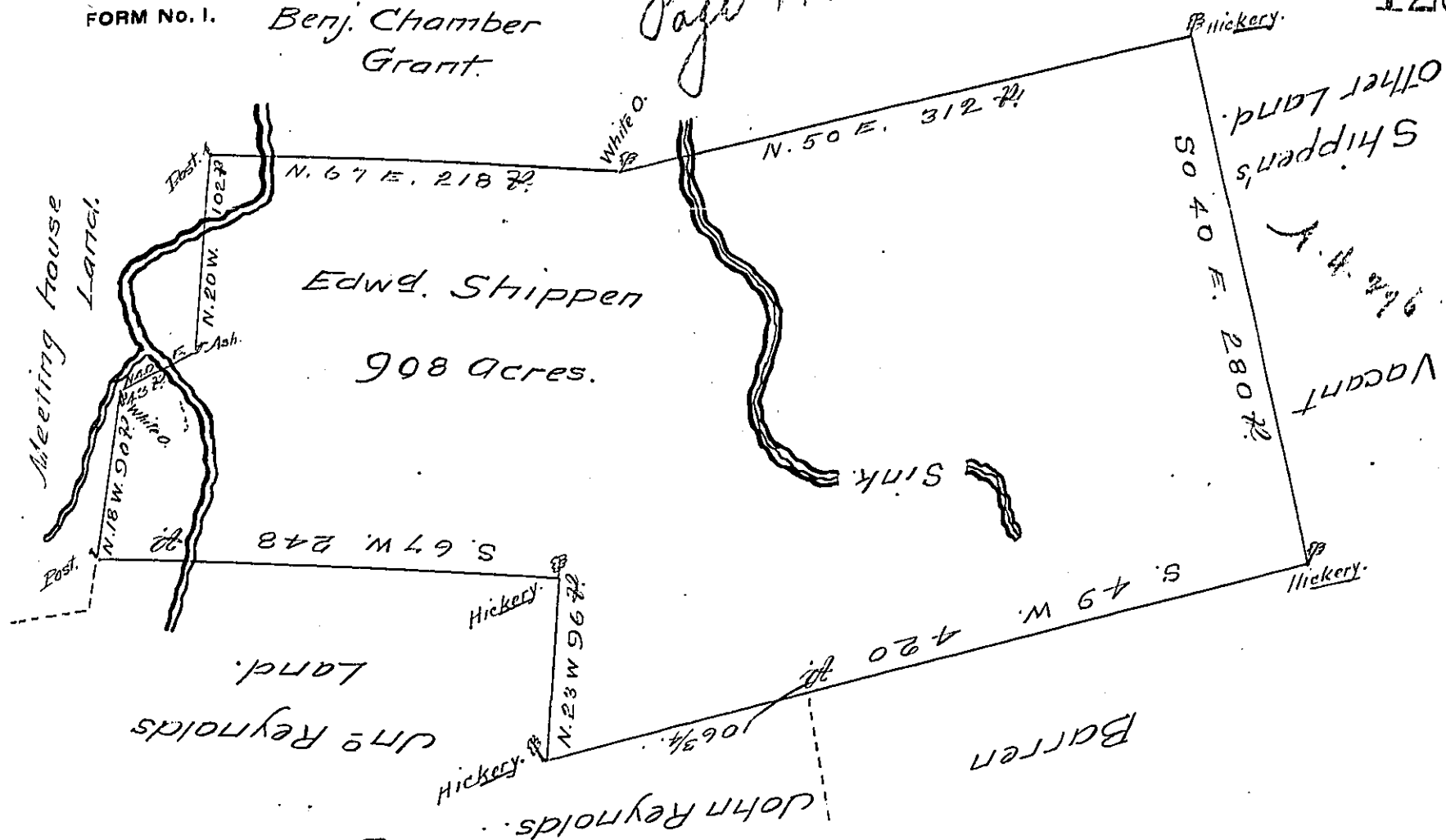

By virtue of a Warrant from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing Date the seventeenth Day of January Anno Dom. 1737 I have Surveyd and Laid out unto Edward Shippen in the Township of Hopewell in Lancaster County on the west side Susquehanna River: Nine hundred and Eight acres with allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent. Beginning at a Hickery in the line of John Reynolds Land Thence by the S^d. Land North Twenty three Degrees Westerly Ninety Six $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a Hickery Thence South Sixty Seven Degrees Westerly Two hundred and forty Eight $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a post Thence North Eighteen Degrees Westerly Ninety perches to a White Oak Thence North forty Degrees Easterly forty three $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to an Ash Thence ^{north} Twenty Degrees Westerly one hundred $\frac{1}{2}$ two perches to a Post Thence North Sixty Seven Degrees Easterly Two hundred and Eighteen perches to a white ^{oak} Thence North Fifty Degrees Easterly Three hundred and Twelve $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a Hickery Thence South forty Degrees Easterly Two hundred and Eighty $\frac{1}{2}$ ches to a Hickery Thence South forty Nine Degrees westerly four hundred and twenty perches to the place of Beginning.
