



By VIRTUE of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Dated the thirteenth day of Septem^r. 1734 Surveyed unto Ulrick Sheer a Tract of Land situate ^{near} ~~at~~ Maxetawny in the County of Philad^a. - Beginning at a post a corner of Jacob Hill's land thence by the same South Seventy Degrees West Seventy perches to a Black Oak Sapling thence by sd. Jacob Hill's land North Twenty Degrees West one-thirty five perches to a post thence by sd. Hills Land South Seventy Degrees West one hundred Twenty five perches to a post thence by vacant Land South Twenty degrees East Two hundred Sixty six perches to a post thence by vacant Land North Seventy Degrees East one hundred Ninety five perches to a post thence by vacant & land of Peter Wentz North Twenty Degrees West one hundred thirty one perches to the place of Beginning Containing Two hundred & Fifty acres with the usual allowance of six ¹/₂ Cent
