



By Order of the Proprietary Surveyed on the 30th Day of March Anno Dom 1738. to Josiah Scot a tract of Land Situate in the Township of Hempfield in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Hickory in the line of Jacob Heestert's land thence North 62 deg. West 154 per. to a Gum: thence North 25 deg. west 103 perches to an Ash. thence South 50 deg. west 71 per. to a Black Oak, thence South 40 deg. E. 20 per. to a Black Oak, thence South 50 deg. West 60 per. to a Walnut standing by the side of Sicasalunga Creek thence down the said Creek 56 perches to a Hornbeam, thence south 16 deg. East 153 per. to a Black Oak, thence South 87 deg. East 159 perches to a post thence North East by East 54 perches to a post thence East North East 76 perches to a white oak, thence North 57 perches to the place of Beginning Containing three Hundred ^{two} acres and the allowance of six acres ¹/₁₀₀ Cent for Roads & Highways.
