



By Order of the Proprietary Surveyed the 28th Day of March Anno Dom. 1738 To John Speer a Tract of Land Situate in the Townships of Donegal & Hempfield in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Black Oak in the Line of Grace Pedens Land thence North 43 deg. West 129 per. to a white Oak Standing on the side of Sickasawunga Creek thence up the sd. Creek 45 perches to a hickory thence South 65 deg. West 22 per. to a hickory thence North 70 deg. West 122 per. to a hickory thence South West by South 76 per. to a hickory thence South East by East 180 per. to a Black Oak thence South 48 deg. East 147 per to a Black Oak thence North East by North 80 per. to a hickory thence North 28^{deg} West 48 per. to a Black Oak thence North East 25 per. to the place of Beginning Containing two Hundred & ten acres and the allowance of six acres & Cent for Roads & highways.
