S. consented to take this but expects to have y<sup>e</sup> Interest & Q. Rent till the time of this Survey abated, otherwise he declines to take it.

This Tract with another of 50<sup>acs</sup> adjoining both Returned within one description. Quanty in both called 150<sup>a</sup>-111 & Allow.
