


In Pursuance of an Order from the Commissioner of Property dated the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June 1772, a Survey was made on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of July 1772, for George Dringler on a Certain Lot of Ground Situate in the Town of Sunbury in the County of Northumberland, marked in a General Plan of said Town Number Two Hundred and Sixty five. Containing in Breadth East & West on Poakberry Street Sixty feet, and in Length North and South two Hundred and thirty feet. Bounded Southward by Poakberry Street, Eastward by River Street, Northward by Gooseberry Alley, and Westward by Lot Number Two Hundred and Sixty six. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 19<sup>th</sup> day of September 1776, for Stephen Sutton.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this nineteenth day of November 1906.
