



Situate formerly in Manchester now in Paradise Township in the County of York containing as above set forth fourteen Acres, One hundred and five perches and allowance of six per cent. for roads &c. Being part of a larger tract of 348^{ac} 22^{pc} & allowance. Originally Surveyed by Charles Lukens late D.S. in pursuance of two warrants One granted to John Penschaw for 100^{ac} dated the 16th day of August 1750 the other granted to Jacob Stamm for 100^{ac} dated the 31st day of May 1762. The above part resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract on the 8th day of February 1822 for Catharine Eyster the present owner of said part, at whose request the same is returned for confirmation.
