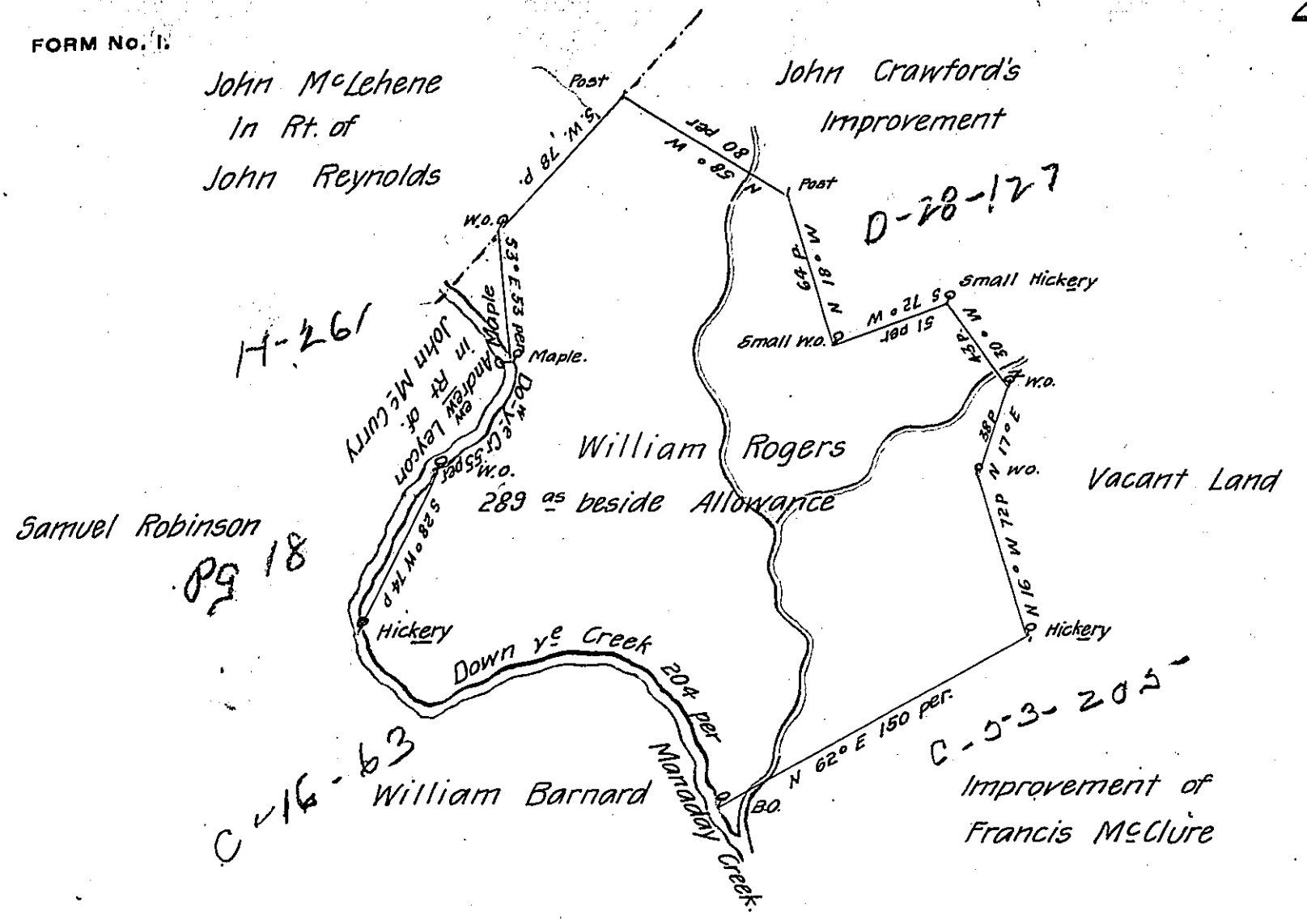

By Virtue of a Warrant dated the 11th day of April Anno Domini 1744 the above described Tract of Land was surveyed to William Rogers in Hanover Township in Lancaster County Beginning at a Black Oak standing by Manaday^a Creek thence North 62 degrees East by the improvement of Francis McClure 150 perches to a hickory thence North 16 Degrees West 72 perches to a White Oak Thence North 17 Degrees East both by Vacant Land 38 perches to a Hickery White Oak Thence North 30 Degrees West by D^o 43 Perches to a small^a thence South 72 degrees West by 5^d Land 51 perches to a Small White Oak Thence North 18 Degrees West by John Crawford 64 perches to a post Thence North 58 degrees West by s^d Crawford 80 perches to a post in John McLehene's Line thence South West on s^d Line 78 perches to a White Oak Corner of Andrew Leycon Thence south 3 degrees East 53 perches to a maple by Manaday Creek thence down the same on the several courses thereof 55 perches to a White Oak thence South 28 degrees West by Samuel Robinson 74 perches to a Hickery by the said Creek thence down the same on the several Courses thereof 204 Perches to the Place of Beginning Containing Two Hundred and Eighty Nine Acres Beside the Usual Allowance
