



In pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the 21st day of April A. D. 1794 was surveyed for Harmon Ross. The 31st day of January 1817. The above discribed tract of Land containing 415 acres 16 perches and allowance of Six per. Cent for Roads &c. and at the time of Making said survey, George Mason,* was in possession of the same and there appered to be upwards of 25 acres of the land Cleared and fenced, a house fit for the habitation of man & a Grist Mill and other buildings - Situate in Venango Town-ship Crawford County Pennsylvania.
