Notand- According to the Direction, We Were Boxing Several line Trees in the presence of Some Neighbours, in order to discover the Number of Years how long ago this Tract hath been first Surveyed, and found by the marks to be Twenty Seven, and upon further Enquiry made of Several of the Neighbours, I found their Information to agree to the said Number of Years, That this Land had been first Surveyed By Edward Scull, unto Adam Engler probably without a Warrant.
