



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Upper Milford Township, in the County of Northampton (formerly Bucks) and Province of Pennsylvania, Containing together Thirty Eight acres and 142 perches of Land, together with the usual allowance at Six per Cent for Roads That formerly was Surveyed unto John Koocken, in Pursuance of a Warrant from the Honble Proprietaries, Dated on the 28th. Day of May Anno, 1750 granted to John Miller, who sold and assigned his Right to the Same, on the back of the said Warrant unto the said John Koocken, who sold and Conveyed his Right to the same unto his Son Henry Koocken, By an agreement of the 4<sup>th</sup>. September Anno 1761. - who again sold and assigned the same to Christian Miller on the 22d. January Anno 1765 Who also now Sold and Conveyed the same in Three Parts (as above described) unto Martin Werffel, John Shout and Anthony Stehler as by their Several agreements, Dated on the 19<sup>th</sup>. November Anno 1768 - may appear.
