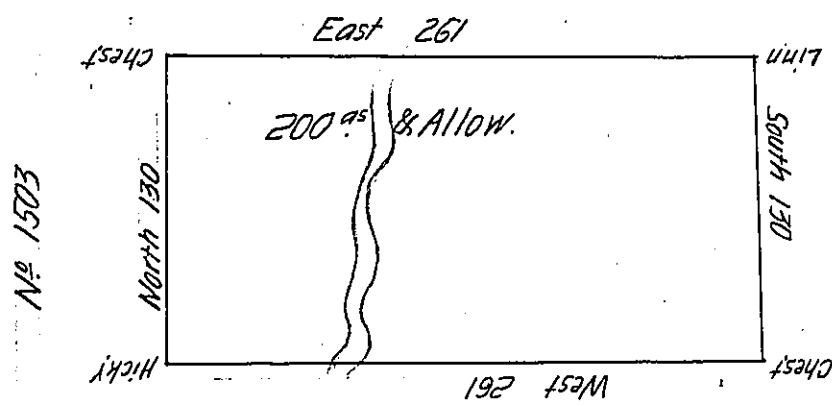

In Pursuance of An act of Gen<sup>l</sup> Assembly of the state of Pennsylvania passed the 24<sup>th</sup> day of February 1785 Intituled 'An act for Directing the mode of Distributing the Donation Lands promised to the troops Of this Commonwealth' & by order of the surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup> With the Approbation of the Hon<sup>l</sup> the Executive Council I have surveyed on the 27<sup>th</sup> day of Aug<sup>r</sup> 1785 the Above Discribed tract of two Hundred Acres & Allow. of 6 P. Cent for Roads &c. N<sup>o</sup> MCCCCLXXXII situate in Dist. N<sup>o</sup> 7 On the west side of the Alleg<sup>y</sup> River in the County of Westmarland.
