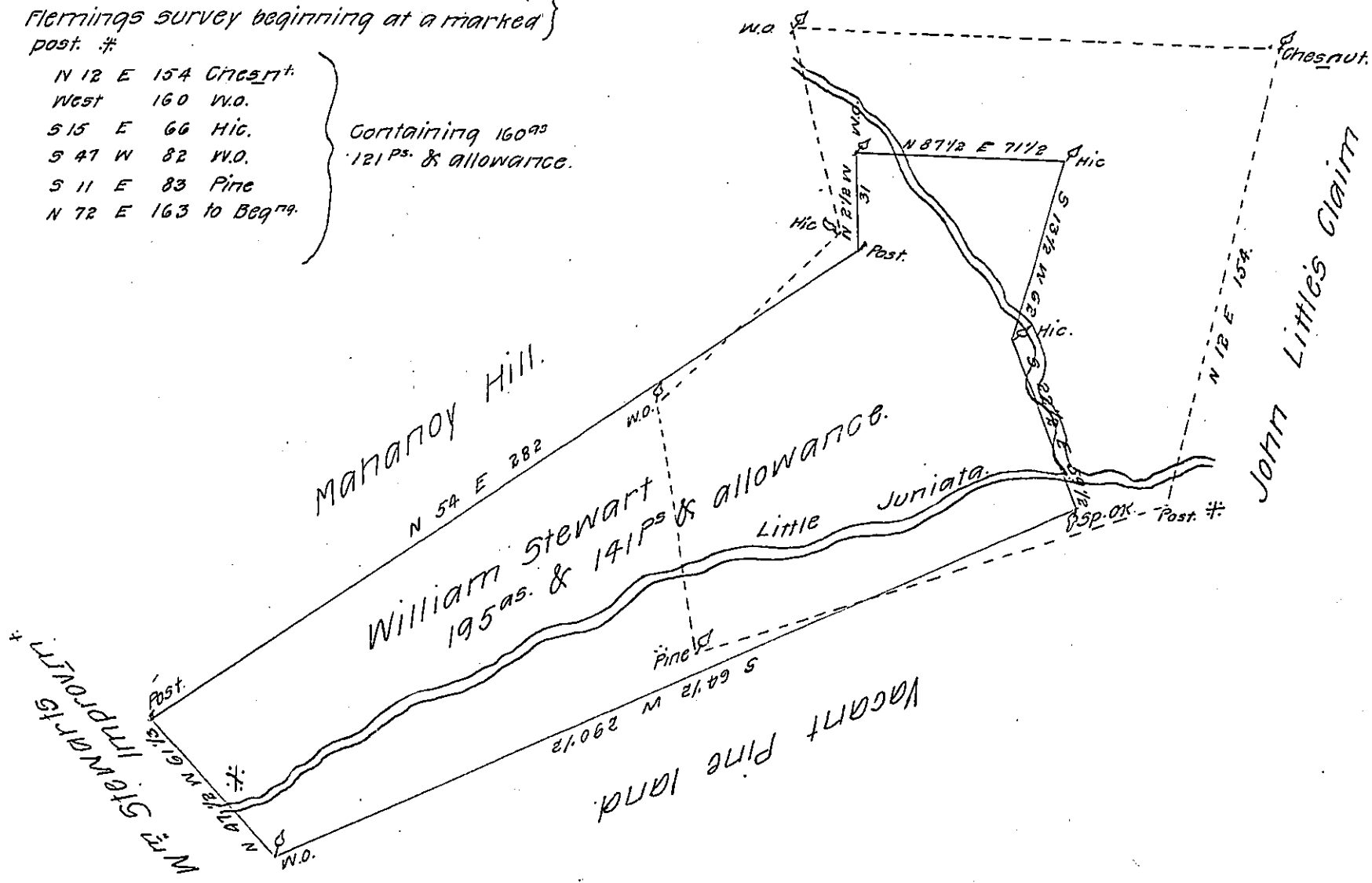


Courses and distances of Charles Flemings survey beginning at a marked post. #
