Situate N.W. of the Allegheny river on the Main branch of Sugar Creek about Three miles from its mouth and adjoining lands Settled by Jonathan King, George King, John Painter, Charles McManness and Nicholas Snow, Sugar creek Township Armstrong County. By Virtue of a Warrant dated May 3<sup>rd</sup> 1814.
