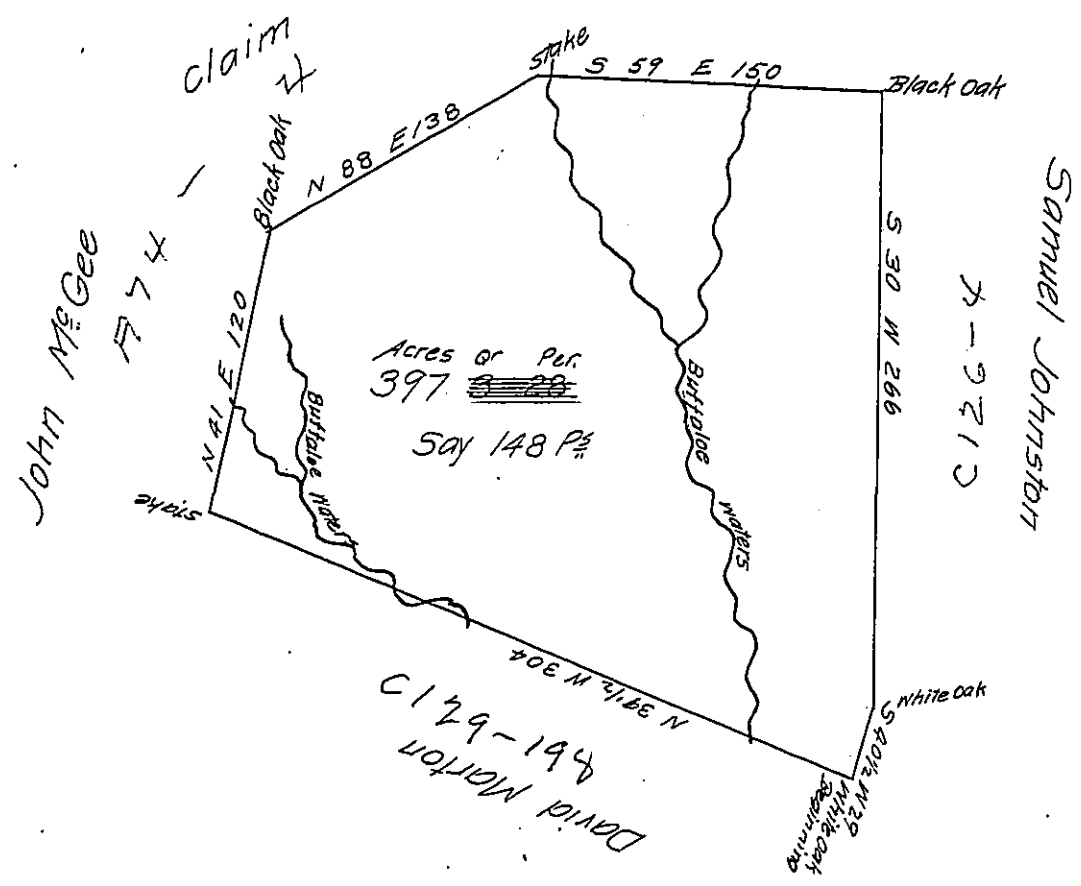

The above is a Draught of a Survey made July 13<sup>th</sup> Day 1787 Situate in Washington County Containing Three Hundred & Ninety seven Acre three quarters twenty eight Poles called the Indians Bureying Ground in Pursuance of a Virginia Certificate Granted as follows We the Commissioners appointed for adjusting the Claim to unpatented Lands in the County of Monongalia Yohogania and Ohio Do hereby Certify that Thomas Chapman is Intitled to four Hundred Acres of Land Situate lying and being in the County of Ohio on the Waters of Buffalo Creek to Include his Settlement made in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and seventy five. Given under Our hands at Redstone Old fort this Sixteenth Day of November 1789 In the fourth year of the Commonwealth. Test. Ent<sup>d</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> Dec<sup>r</sup> 79
