



Situated on the two Mile Run, Waters of Quemahoning Creek, and on both sides of the Great Road leading from Bedford to Pittsburgh, in Quemahoning Township, Bedford County, and Surveyed the 18th day of August 1786. And returned into the Surveyor General's Office, in Consequence of a Warrant for 300^a dated the 6th day of September 1784, on the Waters between the Shade Run, and Sandy Run, bounded by Land of John Roberts to the North West, and Mary Sherry to the East in Quemahoning Township, Bedford County, which Right could not be satisfied agreeable to the Location thereof by reason of Prier Rights and Surveys made formerly for John Musse & Comp^y. Therefore the above was made at the request of John Roberts, the present owner, and in pursuance of an Act of Assembly in favor of the removal of unsatisfied Rights within the limits of the Old Purchase.
