



By Virtue of a warrant from the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Proprietaries bearing date the twenty sixth day of April Anno 1742.

I have surveyed and laid out unto Jacob Mills in the Township of Hopewell, in the County of Lancaster, on the West side of Susquehanna River Two hundred & 1 acres of land with allowance of six <sup>10</sup> Cent. Beginning at a Walnut Tree in the line of James Harlans Land thence North fifty five degrees West orly one hundred and seventy one perches to a White Oak, Thence North thirty five degrees Easterly two hundred perches to a Spanish Oak, Thence South fifty five degrees Easterly one hundred and seventy one perches to a post, Thence South thirty five degrees West orly Two hundred perches to the place of Beginning.
