



Vacand Land

Begining at a Large black oak by the Sid of the west branch of Delawar River then South one hundred perch by vacand Land to a white oak then East three hundred and two perches by vacand Land to a white oak then North Eighty Eight perch by vacand Land to a hickry by the sid of the west branch of the River then upp the Serral Corses of the Same to the place of begining Containing one hundred and Sixty Eight Acres with usal alowance for Roads Surveyed in the county of bucks being the place that John Moor lived upon by the west branch of Delawar on the 16 day of the — month in the year 1733. By me John Chapman.
