By virtue of a warrant from the Commiss^{ers} of Property dated y^e 18th of the 12^{mo} 1701 for laying out unto John Marshal 300^a in y^e Servants Township Surveyd the 3^d of y^e 3^{mo} 1703 unto John Marshal three hundred acres of Land in the Servants Township in the County of Bucks Beginning at a hickry tree in the line dividing the Counties of Philad^{ia} & Bucks and at the Corner of James Cooper's land from thence extending by the s^d Cooper's land north east 320 per. to a Spanish oak thence north west 150 per: by vacant land to a black oak thence South west by vacant land 320 per. to a Spanish oak in the said line dividing the Counties. Thence by the same South east 150 perches to the beginning.
