



In Pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the fifteenth day of July 1816 granted to Thomas Smith was surveyed on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of July 1817 The above described tract of land containing 401 acres 142 perches and allowance of six per cent. for roads, &c. situated in fallowfield township, Crawford county, and at the time of making the same, Thomas Smith was residing thereon, and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upwards of 10 acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, and that the same was divided as above stated, between Joseph Clark and Thomas Smith.
