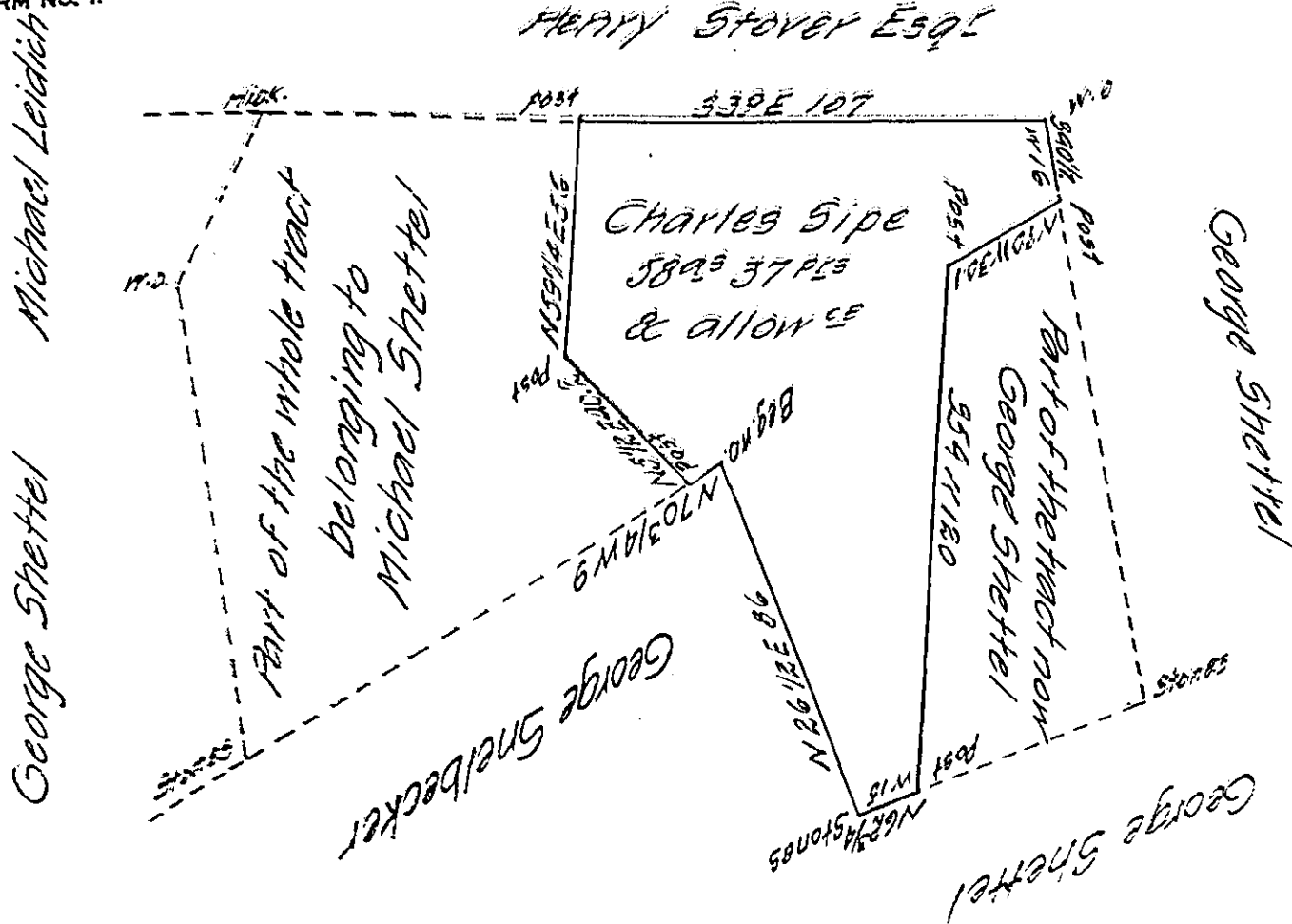

Situate formerly in Dover, now in Conewago Township in the County of York containing as above set forth fifty eight acres, thirty seven perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Being part of a larger tract of 148<sup>ac</sup> 48<sup>p</sup> & allowance originally surveyed by John Forsyth Esq. late D.S. on the 4<sup>th</sup> day of August A.D. 1786 for the heirs of Charles Sipe, in pursuance of a warrant granted to the said Charles Sipe dated the 20<sup>th</sup> day of July A.D. 1749. The above part resurveyed and divided off from the said larger tract, on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of September 1786 by Conrad Laub Assistant D.S. under the said John Forsyth late D.S. and now at the request of the present owner Philip Sipe, the Draught is examined, corrected calculated, and returned for confirmation February 28<sup>th</sup> 1822.
