



In pursuance of an act of General Assembly of the state of Pennsylvania passed the 24 day of February 1785 entitled "An act for directing the mode of distributing the donation lands promised to the troops of this Commonwealth. And by order of the Surveyor General with the Approbation of the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Executive Council I have Surveyed on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of July 1785 the above discribed tract of two hundred Acres and Allowance of six per cent for roads &c. NO. MCCCXXVI situate in district no 10 on the west side of Alleghany river in the County of Westmoreland to John Lukens Esquire S.G. D. Watts
