



In pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24th day of February, 1785, "entitled "An Act for directing the mode of distributing the donation Lands promised to the Troops of this Commonwealth. And by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Honor<sup>ble</sup> the Supreme Executive Council. I have surveyed on the 13th day of October 1785, the above described Tract of Two Hundred Acres of land and Allowance of six p<sup>ct</sup> Cent for Roads &c N° IV situate in district N° 1. on the West side of the Allegany River in the County of Westmoreland.
