



In pursuance of a Warrant of 400 acres of land Granted to Thomas Tillyer, dated 14th day of April A.D. 1792 was surveyed on the 24th day of December 1829 the above described tract of land containing three hundred ninety six acres thirty eight perches and allowance of six per cent for Road &c. and that the same was divided between Adam Holliday, and the heirs of James Kerr Esqr. de^{cd} as represented by dotted line on the above draft the said Adam Holliday 150^{ac} 12^{ps} off the west end of said Tract and 246^{ac} 26^{ps} of the east end for the use of the heirs of the said James Kerr Esqr. de^{cd} and that said Holliday was residing on his part of the land ~~and~~ & Mary the widow of s^d Kerr and Children were residing on their part and there apere^d to be upwards of 50 ac. under Cultivation situated in

Oil Creek Township Crawford County Pennsylvania.
