



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Eleventh day of June 1734 Surveyed unto William Williams a Tract of land Situate in New Britain in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a post a Corner of Lewis Evans land thence by The Same South forty Degrees East Seventy Eight perches to a post thence by land of Thomas Jones South West forty Nine perches to a White Oak thence by the 5^d Jones's land North West Twenty Eight perches to a White Oak thence by the 5^d Jones's land South West Thirty Eight perches to a White Oak thence by the 5^d Jones's land North West twelve perches to a post a Corner of Evan Thomas's land thence by the 5^d Thomas's land the Same Course ^{Thirty Eight Perches} to a Black Oak a Corner of 5^d Williams other land thence by the same North East Ninety four perches to the place of Beginning Containing Thirty five Acres and one Quarter with the Usual Allowance of Six P. Cent.

Surveyed June 14th 1734.
