



In pursuance of a warrant for 400 acres dated the tenth day of April 1793 granted to Patrick Short was surveyed on the 12th day of September 1820 the above described tract of land containing 399.95 acres 17 perches and allowance of six per cent. for roads, &c. situated in Oilcreek township, Crawford County, and at the time of making the same, Samuel Kerr was residing thereon and there was built a house fit for the habitation of man, and there appeared to be upwards of 20 acres of the land cleared, fenced and in a state of cultivation, ~~and that the same was divided as above stated between~~
