Draught of two tracts of land situate on the Aquamshuola Creek in Toamensing Township Northampton County containing in the whole one hundred and eighty two acres and one hundred and thirty five perches and the usual allowance of six per cent for roads &c. I have none of the warrants by virtue <sup>of which</sup> it was originally surveyed neither have I surveyed the land but at the request of Mr. Nicholas Pox I have calculated the said two tracts from the courses and distances upon his draft and transferred so much of his draft to this paper as he wishes to cover with his patent there is a draft remaining in my office of the forty acres which had been surveyed August the 20<sup>th</sup> 1790 by virtue of a warrant dated the 17<sup>th</sup> of December 1789 to Nicholas Pox and returned to the land office January 28<sup>th</sup> 1823 by the said Nicholas Pox Ser<sup>t</sup> Feby 22<sup>d</sup> 1836
