



By Order of the Proprietary Surveyed the 16<sup>th</sup> day of December Anno Dom: 1735 to John Wilkin a tract of land situate in the Township of Donegal in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Black Oak the Corner of James Anderson's land thence south 8 deg. East 164 per. to a White Oak thence East 12 perches to a Black Oak thence South 2 deg. West 91 per. to a Spanish Oak thence East 38 perches to a hickory thence North 10 per. to a hickory thence East 144 per. to a White Oak thence North 5 deg. East 223 per. to a post thence North 85 deg. west 234 perches to the place of Beginning Containing Two hundred & ninety five acres and the allowance of six acres p Cent for roads & highways
