



this is a rough mountain survey, and does not close so well as it obliterated F.L.

Situate on the westerly side of Laurel hill (or Chestnut ridge) on Tuckers Run, a branch of Dunbars run, in Dunbar township, Fayette County and surveyed the 19th day of March 1834. In pursuance of a Warrant for 200 as. of land in the names of George Thompson, John Knox & Joseph Torrence, dated the 24th day of December 1792 at the time of surveying this tract there was no other improvement than some cord wood cut from about an acre of the land and a shanty, or hut, such as is generally used by wood choppers & coliers.
