



In pursuance of an Act of General Assembly of the State of Pennsylvania passed the 24th day of February 1785 entitled An Act for directing the mode of distributing the Donation Lands promised the Troops by by this Commonwealth and by order of the Surveyor General with the approbation of the Honourable the Executive Council, I have surveyed on the 15th Day of November 1785 the above described Tract of Two Hundred Acres of Land & allow<sup>e</sup> of Six p<sup>r</sup> Cent for Roads &c. N<sup>o</sup> CCCXCVII situate in District N<sup>o</sup> 2 on the West side of Allegany River in Westmoreland County.
