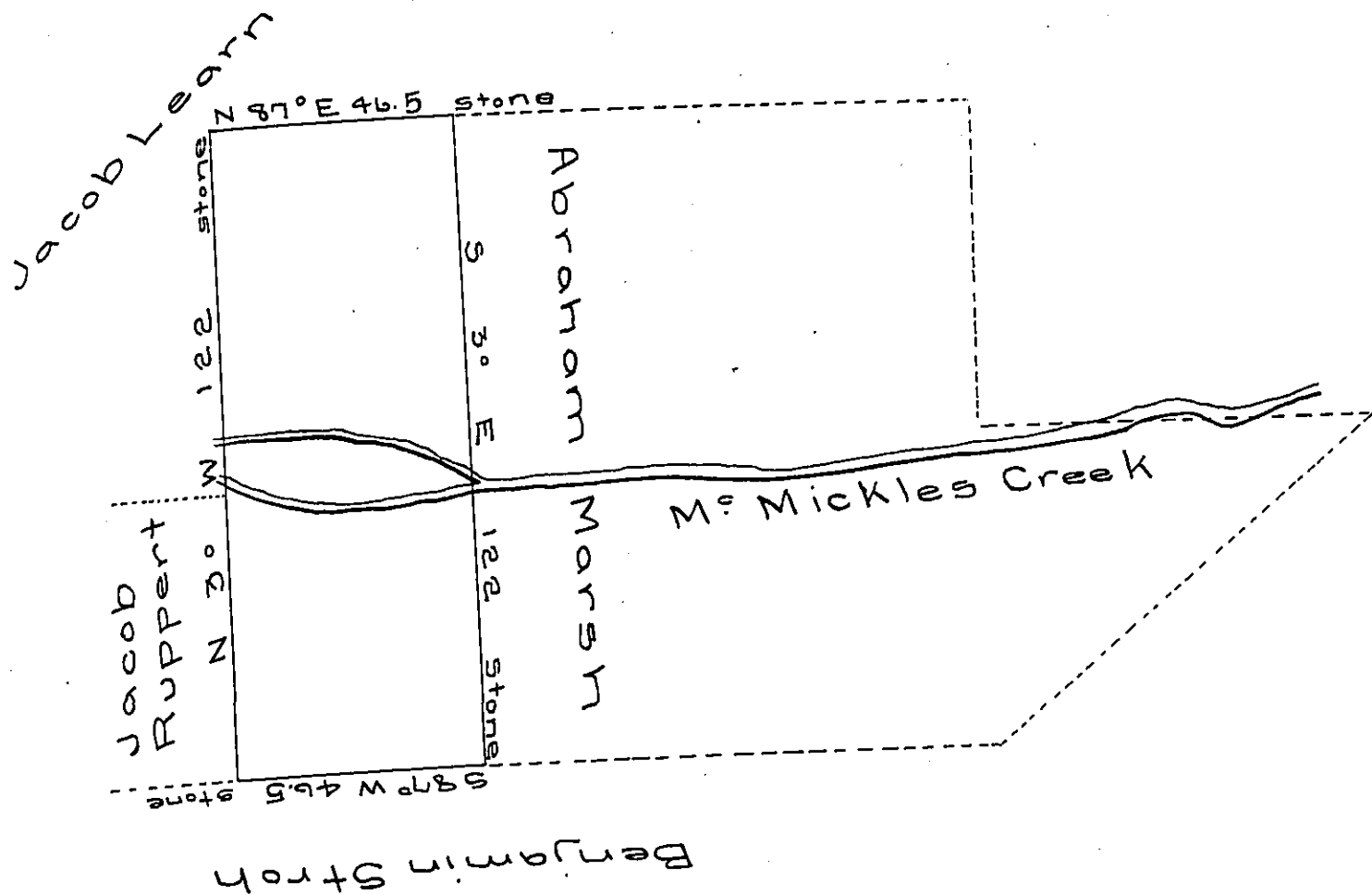


FORM NO. 1.



By virtue of an application N<sup>o</sup> 1675 dated the 30<sup>th</sup> June AD. 1766 surveyed the 14 & 15<sup>th</sup> June 1836 to Andrew Storm Administrator of the estate of John Storm, deceased, and in trust for the heirs of the said dec<sup>d</sup>. The above described tract of land, situate in Hamilton township, (formerly Northampton now) Monroe County containing thirty-three acres and fifty-three perches, and the allowance of six per cent &c. Being part of a larger tract of one hundred and fourteen acres and forty-seven perches of land with the allowance. Originally surveyed to Henry Alshouse the major part of this tract is cleared, under fence, and the whole in possession of the heirs of said John Storm dec<sup>d</sup>.
