



Situate in Augusta township Northumberland county surveyed the 14<sup>th</sup> day of September 1812 unto Daniel St. Clair by virtue of his warrant dated the 14<sup>th</sup> day of August 1812 and resurveyed on the 19<sup>th</sup> day of July 1842 by virtue of an order of the Board of Property granted to Samuel Reitz the 28<sup>th</sup> day of June 1842, containing one hundred and fifty nine acres & fourteen perches & the usual allowance for roads &c., clear of interference with prior surveys.

P.S. The small piece cut off by the dotted line & marked A. was found to be vacant, and the part marked B. is supposed to have been left out of the St. Clair survey by mistake - Both of which are included by virtue of the above order of resurvey. The dotted line on the North side of the survey represents the interference with the surveys of Jacob & Henry Conrad, and which is excluded by virtue of said order.
