



A draft of a tract of land situate in Washington township in the County of Franklin (formerly in Antrim township in the County of Cumberland) containing thirty five acres and 91 perches and allowance proportional to six p Cent for roads. Resurveyed November 23rd 1792 in pursuance of an order of survey to Solomon Sigrist dated February 19th 1767 No. 2821.

N. B. The above tract, including more land, viz. 46^a in all, appears to have been surveyed the 26th March 1767, and returned so into the surveyor General's office. On surveying George Mannor's tract afterwards, a part of the survey which had been made for Solomon Sigrist, was by Sigrist's consent, cut off and taken in to Mannor's Survey; but ~~it~~ it is alleged, Sigrist's survey has been returned whole as it was first run, and now, at the Instance & Request of said Sigrist and George Mannor's Executors, the survey is now rerevised and the Pine thrown out as was formerly agreed.
