



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in Haycock Township Bucks County, containing as above 106 A. 54 P. and Allowance at the Rate of Six Per Cent Surveyed May ye 10th. 1764 to John Wildhanger, alias Willonger, in Virtue of 2 Warrants, one bearing Date Aug 17th. 1756 and the other ye 18th of Feb. 1757.

The last of the above mentioned Warrants has it "Macungy Township Northampton County" which I conceive must have been owing to some Mistake, as it certainly never was designed to be located elsewhere or otherwise than is above expressed, that is, Joining his (thes^e Wildhangers) own Land, Andrew Dennis (which should have been Dennison) and a proprietary Tract, not in Northampton County, for he never owned Land there, but in Bucks, where he has constantly lived, & where are all his Connexions. By "his own Land" in thes^e Warrant was meant the Land which was to be surveyed to him by Virtue of his former Warrant, and by the "proprietary Tract" was meant, I conceive, only vacant Land.
