



Situate in Windsor township in the County of York containing within the black lines as above set forth 96<sup>9</sup>/<sub>16</sub> & 49 perches and allowance. Being part of a larger Tract of 227<sup>9</sup>/<sub>16</sub> & 55 P<sup>s</sup> and allowance, which was Originally surveyed by William Matthews late D.S. on the 2<sup>d</sup> of the 3<sup>d</sup> m<sup>o</sup> 1765, in pursuance of a warrant for 150<sup>ac</sup> granted to John Slifer bearing date the 3<sup>d</sup> day of July A<sup>o</sup> D<sup>o</sup> 1762. Resurveyed and divided off from the said larger Tract by Peter Spangler, D.S. under Jacob Spangler late D.S. on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of December 1808, and now at the request of Andrew Dice the present owner the same has been calculated, examined and found to be correct and at his request I make return of the Draught for confirmation March 9<sup>th</sup> A<sup>o</sup> D<sup>o</sup>, 1820.
