


In the above Draught the dotted Lines shew where the surveys made for Mathias Tyse & Jacob Bear interfere with each other as also a Small Triangular piece of Peter Keeny's Land included within Tyse's Survey. A Dispute arising between the Heirs of Mathias Tyse & the assigns of Jacob Bear concerning the interfering Lines of their respective Surveys, The Secretary, upon application made to him by the parties at Variance, on the 16th May 1750 refered the matters in difference between the Representatives of Mathias Tyse and the Assigns of Jacob Bear concerning their Lands on Little Swahatawro Creek in Bethel Township Lanc^s Co. to Conrad Weiser and W^m Parsons Esquires and Casper Shirrock to whom the parties are hereby required to produce their Evidence that all matters may be settled and the Lines of both Tracts ascertained & a Draught made & Returned to the Office by W^m Parsons. In pursuance of which order the Referrees went upon the place in Dispute with the Parties and in their presence agreed to & made and run the Lines of both Tracts according to the above Draught wherein it may be observed that the Quantity of the Land in dispute is about 50^{ac} (besides about 1^{ac} of Peter Keeny's Land that was included within Tyse's Survey) whereof the assigns of Jacob Bear retain 41^{ac} & the Representatives of Mathias Tyse the Residue. Jacob Bear's Warrant dated 2^d Mar. 1737.
