



A Plan of a Lot of Ground Situate on the West Side of George Street, in the Town of York, marked on the General Plan of the said Town Number two hundred and twelve, containing in Breadth on the said Street Fifty seven Feet six Inches, and in Length to a Twenty Feet Alley, two hundred and Fifty<sup>Feet</sup> Bounded Eastward with George Street aforesaid, Southward with a Lot of Ground marked on the Plan aforesaid Number two hundred and thirteen, Westward with<sup>a</sup> Twenty Feet Alley, and Northward with a Lot of Ground marked on the said Plan Number two hundred and eleven, formerly Surveyed and laid out for Philip Weber who has built an House thereon according to the Conditions of Settling the said Town.
