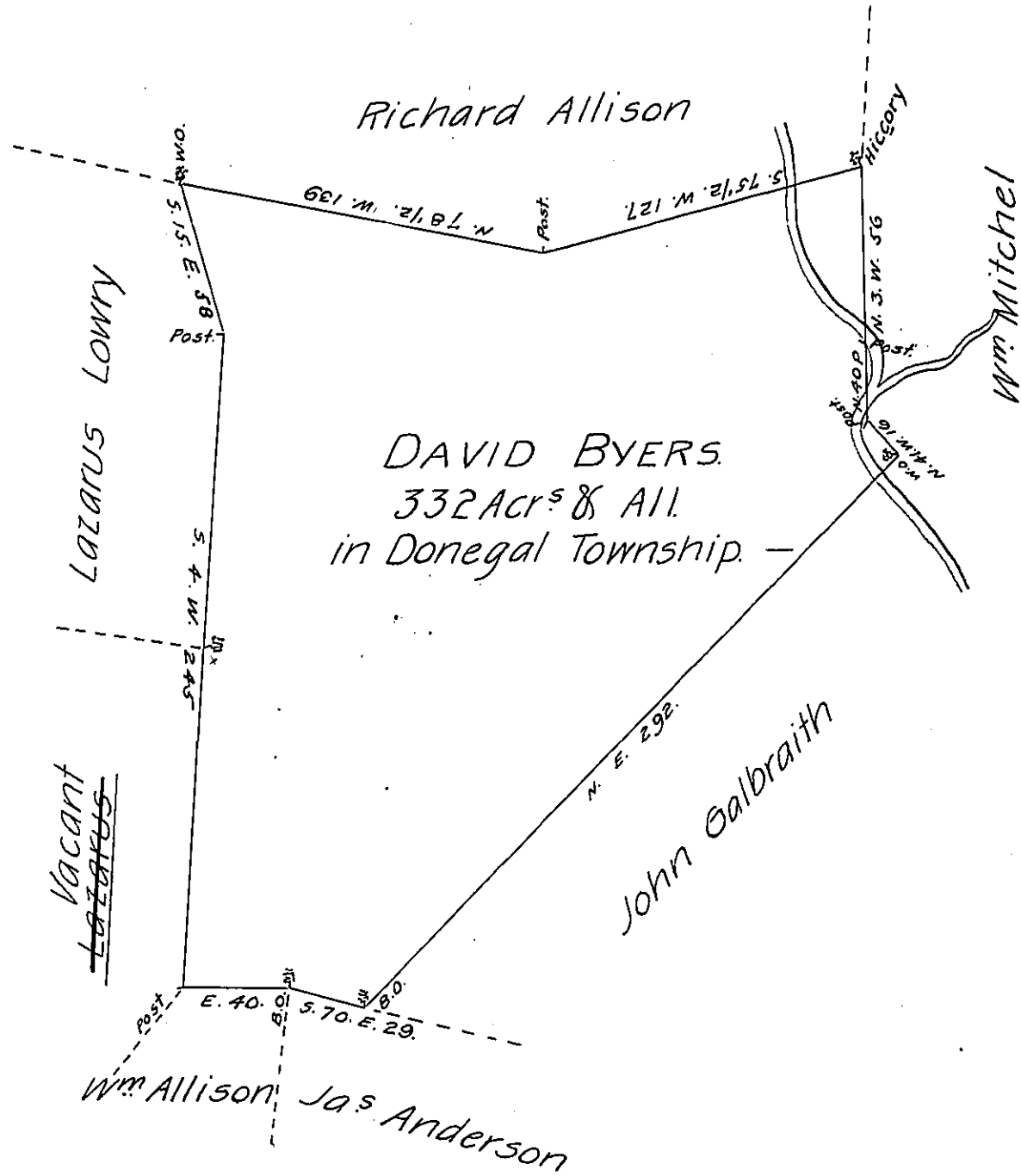

By Order of the Proprietary Survey'd the eighth day of April 1736 to David Byers, A Tract of Land in the Township of Donegal in Lancaster County. Beginning at a Marked Black Oak a Corner of John Galbraith's Land thence North East 292 perches to a White Oak, thence North 41 Deg. West 16 per, thence North 40 per, thence North 3 Deg. West 56 per, thence South 75 1/2 D. West 127 #. to a Post, thence North 78 1/2 D. West 139 #. to a White Oak, thence South 15 Degrees East 58 #. to a post, then East 40 #. to B. Oak, then 5.70. E. 29 #. thence South 4 D. West 245 #. to the place of Beginning. Containing 332 Acres & the Usual Allowance for Roads &c.
