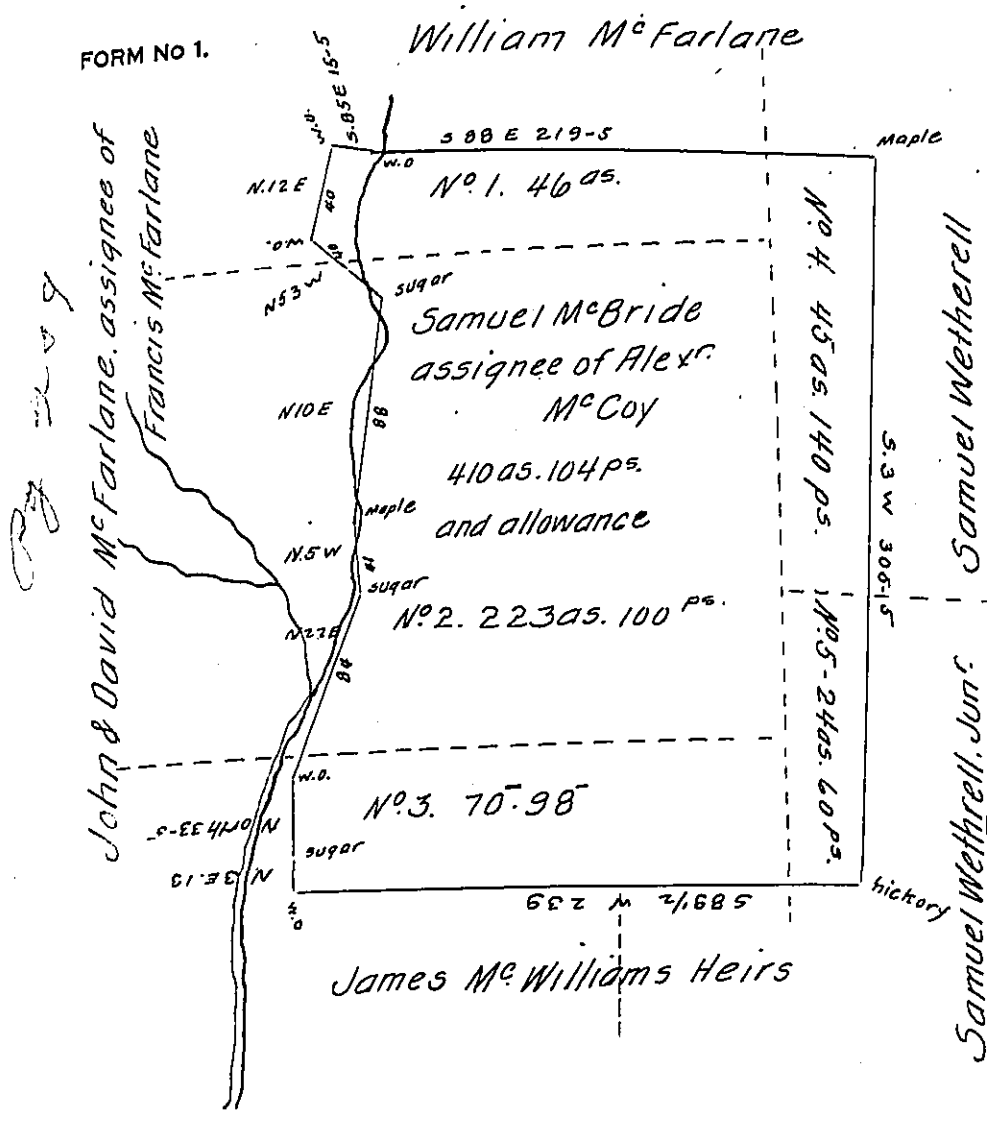

The above is a draught of a Survey made the 4th day of April 1829. in pursuance of an order of Resurvey from the Board of Property bearing date the 11th day of March A.D. 1829. And also in pursuance of five Warrants granted, one to John Wilcocks, Richard Whitehead, William Whitesides, Samuel Wetherell and Samuel Wetherell Junr. taking in a part of each. Situate on the waters-Mahoning Creek, in Mahoning Township Mercer County & State of Pennsylvania, Containing four hundred and ten acres & 104 perches and allowance of Six per cent for roads.

The dotted lines within the Survey represent the Warrant lines, and interferences. The parts are numbered. refereing to the margin for the names of the Warrantees, and quantity of each taken in. - The above warrants are all dated, 14 day April 1792.
