



In pursuance of a warrant from the Proprietaries dated the second day of October A: D: 1735 Surveyed unto Jacob Wygate a certain tract of land situate on Tulpehocken Creek in the County of Lancaster beginning at a post in a line of Casper Stump's land on the northwesterly side of the said creek Thence extending along the said line north north west one hundred and sixty eight pches to a post thence by vacant land along lines of marked trees as followeth Viz West south west two hundred pches to white oak marked south south east one hundred pches to a white oak marked east north east one hundred and twenty pches to a hickery marked and south south east sixty eight pches to a white oak on the side of the said creek thence down the same creek about eighty pches to the place of beginning containing one hundred and fifty acres and the usual allowance of six P cent for roads &c: surveyed the twenty fourth day of October A: D: 1735 Tulpehocken TO: now Berks Co:.
