The addition of 11 1/2<sup>a</sup> was survey'd in pursuance of a warrant granted to Andrew Enslly Dateobl. the 9<sup>th</sup>. of March 1753. The right whereof was purs'd jointly between the owner of this tract & his Neighbour John Duncan.
